This survey course explores the central features of ancient Greek culture: literature, philosophy, art, and science. A&S 1119 can be used to satisfy 3 hours of either humanities or social science credit.

10005	A&S 2999	195	FORMS OF INQUIRY	12:30-1:20 TUES	JOHNSON
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This lecture series exposes students to different disciplinary perspectives. UNO scholars from various fields of study present their research, one faculty speaker per week. Honors students can enroll in the course up to 3 times for credit. A&S 2999 is a one-credit course, and can be used to satisfy a humanities or social science requirement.

10006	A&S 3099	195	MUSIC IN WORLD RELIGIONS	11:00-12:15 MW	BECK
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This course is an introduction to the study of music in the world's religions. Viewing music as an important component of religious experience, this class will introduce the student to many types of religious music of the world, with careful attention to styles of chant, liturgy, and musical expression within specific religious communities. A&S 3099 can be used to satisfy 3 hours of either humanities or social science credit.

10907	ENGL 1159	196	ENGL COMP HONORS	12:30-1:20 MWF	MOONEY

This writing course supplements and is taken concurrently with A&S 1119. It prepares honors students to take the English proficiency exam and satisfies the university's requirement for ENGL 1158.

10943	ENGL 2209	195	INTRO TO DRAMA	11:00-12:15 MW	FINK
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A general introduction to the study and appreciation of drama. ENGL 2209 satisfies 3 hours of the university's 6-credit requirement for literature.

10971	ENGL 2279	197	LIT ANCIENT GREECE	9:30-10:45 TTH	JOHNSON
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This intensive writing course on the art, literature, and philosophy of Ancient Greece is taken concurrently with A&S 1119 and can only be taken by students who have already earned ENGL 1158 credit. ENGL 2279 satisfies 3 hours of the university's 6-credit requirement for literature.

10635	EES 1000	195	DYNAMIC EARTH	9:30-10:45 TTH	SARWAR
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Students study the evolutionary history of the earth, including physical changes and an introduction to the record of life through time. EES 1000 satisfies 3 hours of science credit.

12169	PHYS 1005	195	INTRO ASTRONOMY	11:00-11:50 MWF	SEAB
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PHYS 1005 focuses on naked-eye astronomy, the history and development of astronomy, and the comparative planetology of the solar system. PHYS 1005 satisfies 3 hours of science credit.

12221	POLI 2151	195	AMERICAN GOVT	11:00-12:15 TTH	CHERVENAK
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Emphasizing original, independent, and creative thinking, as well as vigorous class discussion, this class explores the institutions and processes of the U.S. federal government. POLI 2151 can be used to satisfy a social science requirement.

12267	PSYC 1009	195	GENERAL PSYC: HONORS	11:00-12:15 MW	LAHOSTE
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A general introduction to the scientific study of the behavior of organisms, PSYC 1009 satisfies 3 hours of social science credit.

12468	UNIV1001	195	UNIV SUCCESS HONORS	1:30-2:20 TH	ITO

This course discusses in small group format, the optional challenges of college adjustment and life planning for academically gifted students.
